YEAR GROUP	HISTORY ENRICHMENT
Reception	A-Curiosity Cube- objects from the past. Can you guess what it is? Do we still use these today? Why/ why not? How has it changed?
1	C - Helmsley Castle trip – features of a castle, roles of castle dwellers, similarities and differences from castles today. C - Seaside visit every 3 years - how have seaside holidays changed?
2	B - Fire Brigade visit to talk about The Great Fire of London – Similarities and differences between 1666 and now.
3	A- Stone Age artefact resource box hired from Malton Museum so pupils can have hands on experience with the sort of stone tools used from the Mesolithic to Neolithic periods. C- Trip to Murton Park where pupils experience a full day as a Roman soldier in a replica Roman fort. Pupils learn how to write Latin, make clay oil lamps, march in formation like a roman auxiliary and use training weapons like gladius and pilum.



	B- Roman legacy workshop in school provided by Malton Museum. Pupils get to try on Roman outfits, make roman mosaics and learn about the legacy the Romans left behind in Malton and N-Yorkshire.
4	C - Trip to Jorvik/Dig B- Hands on history workshop for Ancient Egyptians
5	B-Ancient Greek workshop provided by Historical Interpretations Hands on History Workshops. Pupils get to handle a range of ancient Greek artifacts. A- Ancient Greece resource box from Scarborough Museum
